# <u>**Iesus Theatre Overview**</u>

The <u>Jesus Theatre</u> is a Creative Arts presentation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, originally created for camp ministries. It is designed for an audience of children/youth and is approximately thirty minutes in length. The production includes theatre and visual art as mediums through which God's story is shared.

### "Balloons" Overview

**Length:** 30minutes **Theme:** Coming Home

**Scriptural themes:** Romans 8:14-17, 1 John 3:1, Luke 15:11-32

Climax: "I am no longer a slave to fear, I am a child of God."

**Basic Overview:** This piece follows the outline of the gospel story told through the lens of family. It begins with God presented as a good Father who creates and celebrates his children. His children rebel and run away from home. Jesus is sent to seek and save the lost children of God. A way is then made for the lost children of God to return home to the Father's love through Jesus, but it is their choice.

**Vision:** To communicate the message that every person is a valued child of God, and that the longing to belong is most deeply satisfied when we come home to the Father's love through Jesus.

### **Introduction** - Including suggested sound effects & motions

PERSON 1: Ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls, children of all ages ... welcome

to the Jesus Theatre. I invite you to turn your attention to the stage.

Our story today begins with a good good Father in a very happy home.

This is Father God.

ALL: The Kingdom of God is a family.

God is our Father. (Point to Father God)
We are His children. (Point to self)

We are all the work of His hands. (Open hands)

PERSON 2: God loves His children so much!

PERSON 3: Some people don't know that God loves them because they don't

know God. And perhaps you don't yet know Him.

PERSON 4: Allow us to introduce you to the family of God. (Use hand to present

the family, everyone waves.)

ALL: God is our Father.

**He is so good.** (Repeat this line to one another as if you can't get over

it.)

PERSON 5: He is affectionate.

PERSON 6: Passionate.

PERSON 7: Present.

PERSON 8: Committed.

PERSON 9: Faithful.

PERSON 1: Strong.

PERSON 2: Fun.

PERSON 3: Safe.

ALL: **A good, good Dad.** 

PERSON 2: Iesus is God's Son.

PERSON 3: He is perfect love. (Awe!)

PERSON 4: It is through Jesus that we become members of God's household.

Anyone who is far away from God's family can be brought near by the blood of Jesus. (Jesus lifts someone up and gives them a high five, they

sit back down.)

PERSON 5: And third in the three in one ...

ALL: **Holy Spirit.** 

PERSON 6: Holy Spirit is God's Presence with us.

ALL: **The breath of God.** (Blow)

PERSON 7: He comforts PERSON 8: Teaches

PERSON 9: And empowers us PERSON 1: To become like Jesus.

ALL: And finally, join me in welcoming ... the children of God. (Everyone

cheers for one another and for the audience)

PERSON 2: That's you!
PERSON 3: That's me!
PERSON 4: That's all of us!

ALL: We are children of God.

PERSON 2: Dearly loved.
PERSON 3: Powerful.
PERSON 4: Known.
PERSON 5: Desired.
PERSON 6: Pursued.
PERSON 7: Celebrated.

PERSON 1: The good news is that

ALL: in God's house, there is room for .... everybody! (Pause after "for"

and then explode with "everybody" cheering!)

PERSON 5: In love He predestined us all to be adopted as sons and daughters;

to take our place in God's family,

ALL: **to belong.** (Nod head)

### **Scene 1: Happy Home (God creates people and celebrates)**

(Narration given while the next scene sets)

NARRATOR: In the Father's house there is fullness of joy. Every child is seen, known, and well loved. We learn from the Father who we are and what we're made for. He is the author of life, the breath of life. He loves to create and celebrate!

### **Scene 2: Getting Deflated** (Children rebel and get deflated)

(Narration given at the end of "Happy." Line begins as new music starts)

NARRATOR: As a good Father, God set up boundaries for His children so that they would stay safe. He made it clear that if they chose to reject these parameters of love, they would end up on a fast track to destruction.

### Scene 3: Running Away (Children run away enslaved)

(Narration given at the end of Scene 2, before Scene 3 music begins)

NARRATOR: God's children forgot who they were and then felt forgotten. They became slaves to fear through sin. Even though the Father was still right there, they were blind to His love because of their disobedience.

(Narration given after Father God settles down holding His heart balloon)

NARRATOR: God's children rebelled. They ran away from home and wasted everything He had given to them. Still the Father loved them so much.

The Father loved them so much that while they were still slaves to sin, He sent His Son Jesus as a gift. God didn't send His son to condemn and judge people, but to save and rescue them! Jesus came to point people back to the Father and help them find their way home.

### Scene 4: Being Rescued (Jesus sent to seek and save the lost)

(Narration given after Scene 3, before Scene 4 music begins)

NARRATOR: Jesus entered into the thick darkness to seek and save the lost children of God. He courageously confronted the evil that bound them and brought healing and deliverance wherever he went. Through Jesus the love of the Father was demonstrated.

(Narration given after the 2<sup>nd</sup> rescue is completed)

NARRATOR: Jesus loved us so much that He took the punishment that we deserved. He humbled himself and became obedient to death, even death on a cross.

(Narration given after Jesus dies on the cross)

NARRATOR: Jesus triumphed over evil on the cross so that we could be free to run home to the Father's love. Three days later, He rose from the dead.

### Scene 5: Coming Home (Children return home to Papa)

(Narration given after the children decide to return home and run off stage. Narration given with intense emotion and excitement!)

NARRATOR: God's children remembered who they were and decided to return home. Jesus death and resurrection had destroyed the barrier between the Father and them so that they could receive forgiveness of sins and run home to the Father without shame.

While they were still a long way off, the Father ran towards them filled with love and compassion. He hugged them so tight. These kids were dead and are now alive. They were lost and are now found. So let the party begin!

### **Closing & Altar Call**

Prompt: Whenever someone meets Jesus it is an invitation to come home to the Father's love. Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. No one can get to the Father except through Him.

One comes up to the beat.</li> <li>0:13 The first child is invited to the stool and excitedly waits. Father God stretches the balloon.</li> <li>0:25 Father God blows up the first balloon for Child #1. She receives it and dances downstage with it. The crowd of children peak around and watch using bird head motions.</li> <li>0:49 Father God prepares for the next child. He uses the balloon pump to blow into the crowd of kids again and another child jumps up and turns around. Child #2 is invited to the stool.</li> <li>1:13 Father God blows up the second balloon for Child #2. 	2:25 Father God invites them all center stage. He pulls out a marker and they watch him draw. Father God draws a bold heart on the balloon and walks downstage to show the audience.
	2:49 The children then pull out their markers and look to His balloon as if copying what they see to draw their own faces on the balloons.
	Once the faces are drawn on the balloons, the balloons pop up with the face drawings held out towards the audience.
	Scene ends with the balloon faces giggling center stage. The children are seated on the floor around Father God.

Meet Tulio (John Powell, Pete Anthony & Hollywood Studio Symphony)	Yes.  Narration given at the beginning of this music.	Set remains the same.	2:55	0:00 Scene begins with Father God setting boundaries through pushing the people together along with the script.  0:19 The Father then shows them to keep their eyes on the balloon.  0:28 The children sway right and then left with their eyes glued on the heart balloon.  0:33 Child #1 gets up and removes God's heart balloon to put herself on the throne. Another child comes and knocks her off.  0:50 The villain enters and sneaks around. He offers Child #1 scissors to cut herself out of the family. She says "No," she's keeping her eyes on the balloon. He offers again and this time she considers and then impulsively accepts and steps outside of the family.  1:22 The villain and Child #1 do the salsa together. He offers her a seat, and then offers to take her balloon to fix it. She gives it to him and he cuts it. She holds it as it deflates.  The villain does an "O well," and heads around to use his scissors to get more children's attention.

The children are pursued and tormented by the black balloons in their hands. They move slow motion into lifeless positions where they freeze.</li> <li>0:28 Father God enters and grabs his heart balloon.</li> <li>0:36 He goes to one of the children and touches her back she lifts up slightly and then plops back down.</li> <li>0:47 He goes to another child and gets his hand on the stick of the balloon, he lifts him up but he just plops back down.</li> <li>0:57 He goes to a third child and takes her hand, spins her around, but she falls back down lifeless.</li> <li>1:07 The Father lifts the heart balloon up. Lowers it like a cutting sword from high right to low left. 
# **Balloon Face Practice**



## Basics of the Stage, Rehearsal, and Casting

Use simple stage directions to avoid confusion.

- **Stage Right**: Facing the audience, actor's right
- Stage Left: Facing the audience, actor's left
- Downstage: Front of the stage (older theaters the stage would be slanted down towards the audience)
- **Upstage**: Back of the stage
- **Center**: Center of the stage
- Quarter: Halfway between the center and the side end of the stage
- House Right: Audience's right
- House Left: Audience's left



#### **Rule of Thumb**

- Never turn your back to the audience, unless it is a clear choice.
- When interacting with another actor profile, keep slightly open to audience, they should always feel included and welcomed in what's happening on stage.
- If you can see the audience, they can see you.
- Don't stand too close to the edge of the stage. The audience should be focused on the story rather than wondering if the actor will fall.

#### **Backstage Etiquette**

- It's helpful to create a backstage area so that actors have a place to be while not performing on stage, it also defines the performing space. If you don't have a built-in backstage area consider using material (pipe and drape).
- Backstage is part of the stage. Conversation should wait until after the show.
- Keep backstage props confined to designated space. (Props should be easily accessible and organized to avoid confusion)
- Be aware of other actor's entrances and exits to avoid collision.

#### **Rehearsal Techniques**

- Get to rehearsal space early to set up.
  - o Setup: Music
  - o Make sure furniture is not in your way
  - o Have props ready for scenes that will be worked on
- Set specific goals for each rehearsal. Share your goals with your cast at the start of rehearsal, "The goal for this rehearsal time is to finish the opening scene and begin..." But keep in mind that some things will change as rehearsal progresses; be open to changing your goals.
- Your cast will reflect what you, the director projects. If you are tired and worn out you will very quickly see your cast go from excited and energized to lethargic and unfocused. Prepare yourself physically and mentally for rehearsals. Rehearsal time requires more from the director than it does from the cast. Be prepared!
- Consider having closed rehearsals. Having people watching rehearsal creates extra noise and distraction that will quickly eat up your time. Don't be afraid to tell people that they can come back and watch during a final run-through.
- Consider your cast size. Too many people can create confusion and make focused rehearsal time harder to achieve.
- Include prayer in every rehearsal. Times of prayer help people stay focused on the mission of the project as well as aware of God's empowering presence.

#### Casting

• Consider teaching one of the movement sections and one of the speaking sections from the piece to everyone at the beginning of your rehearsal process so that you can gage your cast's abilities. It's ok if they don't all end up performing what you've taught. This is an easy way for you to figure out casting without holding an audition, which creates unnecessary pressure.

# **Altar Call Training for Jesus Theatre**

#### Giving an effective Altar Call after the Jesus Theatre involves:

- (1. Understanding the message and imagery of the piece
- (2. Translating that message into a personal invitation
- (3. Partnering with Holy Spirit

#### **Choosing the Right Person**

Consider choosing someone for this role who is gifted in partnering with Holy Spirit to communicate well and introduce people to Jesus. It also helps if this person is well acquainted with the Jesus Theatre piece and carries authority as a spiritual leader.

### Giving the Altar Call

During the last scene of the piece, start praying for wisdom and insight on how to partner with what God is doing in the room. At the close of the piece, move to the microphone and begin the invitation.

- (1. <u>Share</u> that this moment is an invitation for people to give their lives to Jesus, just like the closing scene.
- (2. Recap the story briefly using the imagery from the piece that the children have just seen. Link the story to a personal application for their lives explaining what it means to "Come Home."
- (3. <u>Give the invitation</u> by inviting those who want to receive Jesus as Lord of their life to stand up and come forward.

### **Prayer Time**

Use your cast as the prayer ministry team along with a few other spiritual leaders on camp. (Note: See "Jesus Theatre Prayer Team" below).

(1. Once the children have come forward and settled, do a repeat after me salvation prayer with everyone who has responded to the altar call.

<u>Example Salvation Prayer</u>: Dear Jesus, I believe that you are the Son of God. I believe that you died on the cross for my sins. I am a sinner and I ask for your forgiveness. I want you to be the leader of my life and my best friend. I invite you to come into my heart right now and become Lord of my life.

Jesus, I choose to come home today through giving my life to you. Help me to always live my life for you. Amen.

(2. Invite the ministry team members to pray over the children near them.

Prayer Ministry team members can ask children if they can pray for them, and then: (1. Bless & agree with what God is doing in the children's lives for salvation and (2. Offer to pray for them for the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

(3. Direct people to return to their seats and/or linger in what God is doing. Dismiss the audience and/or hand the meeting over to whoever is there to direct the people to their next activity.

#### Follow-Up

<u>That evening</u>: It is recommended that the Cabin Devotions after the Jesus Theatre are an intentional time of debriefing the children's experience. Some ideas include:

- Do they understand the story they saw? (Explain if needed)
- Were there any moments of the piece that stood out to them?
- What did they experience/feel from God?
- Did anyone give his or her life to Jesus for the first time?
- Document the testimonies.

<u>Following Day</u>: Consider making reference the next day to what happened in the children's lives at the Jesus Theatre the night before.

Ongoing: Partner with camp staff and/or corps to provide follow-up.

#### **Suggestions for Logistics:**

- Develop a "Jesus Theatre Prayer Team," who will help pray for kids at the Altar as well as intercede during the piece.
- Assign 4-6 other people ahead of time to help direct traffic. They can send a few kids to each ministry team member.

#### **Suggestions for Altar Call Process & Flowing with Holy Spirit:**

- Learn to <u>pause/wait</u> during the invitation, as you feel led. Holy Spirit is breath, and you can learn to breath with Him allowing those in your care to enter into the divine moments that present.
- Feel free to make <u>multiple invitations</u> if you feel that God is still working in the room among the audience.

- Don't try to do the Holy Spirit's job. <u>Manipulation or control of any kind are not necessary</u> and can be harmful.
- <u>Keep the people in the room engaged</u> in what is happening by encouraging them to stay quiet or pray to respect what God is doing.
- For the repeat after me prayer, you can tell the children that you are going to lead them in a prayer to surrender their lives to Jesus. But that salvation is not in the words of the prayer but in the <u>position of their hearts</u> before God.
