SS25 Group B | Jesus Feeds Five Thousand By Kathryn Higgins

Written for Star Search Group B based on Mark 6 30-44 NLT. Written for a minimum of four actors (doubling the NARRATOR as a disciple), this interactive piece submerges the actors into the audience, breaking the fourth wall while animating a well-known story of one of Jesus' miracles. To accommodate for more actors lines may be share/divided but not changed. Actors are encouraged to mime the food instead of physical props.

ALL	Jesus Feeds Five Thousand.
NARRATOR	The apostles-
DISCIPLES	-exhausted – (slump, exhale etc.)
NARRATOR	-returned to Jesus from their ministry tour. They told him all they had done and taught.

Disciples speak simultaneously about the amazing things they have seen/done ex. "Rabbi, there were so many people...I went for three days I found bread... Lazarus got back into competitive speed walking...I haven't slept in a week..."etc.

JESUS	(Lifts up arms.) Friends. (A hush falls on the group.) You're tired. Let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile.
NARRATOR	He said this because there were so many people coming and going that Jesus and his apostles didn't even have time to eat.
DESCIPLES grumble and rub bellies.	
ONE	But there's people everywhere.
TWO	We're swarmed wherever we go.
THREE	I haven't eaten since breakfast yesterday!

ONE Oh look! (Pointing to the distance. All disciples look.) A boat!

TWO Let's ask if we can use it to get away for a bit. We could go fishing!

ALL EXCPT JESUS Yes! Good idea! I love fish. That would hit the spot. Etc.

- NARRATOR So, they left by boat for a quiet place, where they could be alone. At least, they tried to-
- ONE We've been spotted!

ALL EXCPT JESUS Oh no! Here they come! This crowd is huge! *Etc.*

NARRATOR	People recognized them and saw them trying to leave. There were people from many far away towns and villages. Some had walked miles to see Jesus.
ONE	They're running ahead along the shore to get ahead of us!
TWO	We were so close.
THREE	Jesus, can't you tell them we need to rest. We're hungry.
NARRATOR	But Jesus saw the huge crowd. He stepped away from the boat and had compassion on them.
JESUS	They are like sheep without a shepherd. (Jesus mimes preaching to the crowd – use the real-life crowd in front of you for this.)
NARRATOR	So he began teaching them. (Disciples slump/sit down in exhaustion. They grumble.)
TWO	This is gonna be a long one.
THREE	Doesn't this guy get hungry?
ONE/TWO	(Quoting Jesus) 'Man does not live by bread alone.' (They give each other a knowing smile. They assume restful positions.)
NARRATOR	Hours passed. (Disciples change position. They look uncomfortable/tired.)
ONE	You ask him.
TWO	No, you do it.
THREE	We'll do it together.
DISCIPLES walk to	IECUC

DISCIPLES walk to JESUS.

NARRATOR	Late in the afternoon his disciples came to him and said,
THREE	Teacher, this is a remote place, and it's already getting late.
ONE	Everyone is hungry.
TWO	Send the crowds away so they can go to the nearby farms and villages and buy something to eat.

NARRATOR	But Jesus said –
JESUS	You feed them.
Beat.	
DISCIPLES	Huh?
ONE	With what?
THREE	We'd have to work for months to earn enough money to buy food for all these people!
JESUS	How much bread do you have?
DISCIPLES	None.
TWO	We haven't eaten all day.
THREE	Not since breakfast yesterday.
JESUS	Go and find out. (Gesturing to the crowd.)
Disciples begrudgingly walk down stage, or even off stage, asking the actual crowd if they have	

Disciples begrudgingly walk down stage, or even off stage, asking the actual crowd if they have any food.

NARRATOR	So the disciples went into the crowd and asked around if anyone had anything to eat.
ONE	(To the crowd.) Anything at all?
TWO	(To the crowd.) Bread?
THREE	(To the crowd.) Anyone?
NARRATOR	But, most of the people had been walking for days and had eaten all their supplies.

DISCIPLES return to stage, addressing JESUS-

THREE	No bueno, Jesus.
ONE	There must be over 5000 families here, and they've already eaten everything they brought with them.

TWO	We found only five loaves of bread – (placing imaginary bread in Jesus' hands)
THREE	-and one fish. (placing imaginary fish in Jesus' hands)
ONE	Make that, two fish. (placing imaginary fish in Jesus' hands)
JESUS	(Unphased.) Have the people sit down in groups.
THREE	Jesus, this isn't enough.
JESUS	On the green grass. Have them sit in groups of fifty or a hundred.
NARRATOR	So they sat down in groups of fifty or a hundred. (Disciples gesture/mime for crowd to sit.)
TWO	This is not going to go well.
ONE	A crumb is better than nothing, I guess.
THREE	Don't tease me. I'd love a crumb right now.
NARRATOR	(Jesus mimes the actions the Narrator speaks.) Jesus took the five loaves and one fish –
ONE	Two fish.
NARRATOR	Jesus took the five loaves and \underline{two} fish – looked up toward heaven and blessed them.
JESUS	(Quietly.) Thank you, father.
DISCIPLES	(Prayerfully.) Thank you, father.
NARRATOR	Then, he broke the loaves into pieces a lot of pieces.
JESUS	Hand this out to the people over on that side.
ONE	Yes, teacher. (Takes handful of imaginary bread. Distributes it to the real crowd.)
JESUS	Here, give this to the people over there.

TWO	Right away. (Arms become overwhelmed with imaginary food as they take it to the crowd on the opposite side.)
JESUS	And this fish, make sure everyone gets enough.
THREE	(Receiving the final handful of invisible food.) Jesus, how is this –
JESUS looks at THREE with a tender smile. No more needs to be said.	

NARRATOR	It was a miracle.
ONE	There's enough for everyone!
TWO	More than enough!
THREE	Leftovers. Everyone's had their fill and there's piles of leftovers.
NARRATOR	The disciples picked up-
EISCIPLES	(shocked) -twelve baskets-
NARRATOR	-of remaining bread and fish. (Disciples snack/take their fill while Jesus speaks -)
JESUS	Now everyone is fed. Go and rest back in the boat.
ONE	(Mouth full, gesturing to the crowd.) They're leaving.
TWO	They're satisfied.
THREE	(Mouth full.) I'm satisfied!
JESUS	Come. Our work is done here. (To the crowd.) Make your way home.

Jesus and disciples act out what the narrator speaks -

NARRATORAnd so the disciples went to the boat, bellies full and immediately fell
asleep. Jesus walked up into the hills by himself to pray.
(Beat.)
And then suddenly, a great storm rolled in...

Disciples look up from their sleep, scared –

NARRATOR But that's a story for another day.
