

A LETTER, TO THE DIRECTORS



Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you well and encouraged in the Lord's service. I write to express my full support and deep gratitude for the Jesus Theatre ministry as it continues to bear fruit throughout our Territory. This summer, 10 of our Eastern Territory camps, along with the Hands-On Cast team in Puerto Rico, will learn and perform this piece, bringing the Gospel to life through theater. Our prayer is that through every scene, the Holy Spirit will move powerfully and that children will be drawn into a saving relationship with Jesus Christ.

Over the past year alone, we have facilitated over 60 altar calls through Jesus Theatre, and my wife and I have personally witnessed over 6,000 children make first-time or deepening commitments to Christ. These are not just numbers – they are transformed lives, each one a testimony to the Spirit's power working through this ministry.

A few years ago, while serving as Camp Director, I witnessed how the Spirit of God brought such conviction that children began confessing sins unprompted – sins carried in silence until that holy moment. Jesus Theatre is more than a performance – it is a sacred altar space, where campers encounter the living Christ. I pray that each camp presenting this piece will experience a fresh outpouring of the Spirit and that every child will hear the call of Jesus: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14)

Thank you for your continued commitment to sharing the Gospel through this powerful medium. May God use this season to bring many sons and daughters to glory.

PIECE OVERVIEW

Clocks

This year's Jesus Theatre theme is Clocks. In this production, God is represented as the Clockmaker – the Master of Time. This Imagery of God winding up the first big clock to set creation in motion shows how He is in control of the marching of time and its seasons, keeping them in perfect balance. The Clockmaker gifts everyone their own little clocks to march in the rhythm of eternity with the Creator. The Tempter walks in, encouraging the people to take control of time, breaking the perfect ticking clocks the Clockmaker had set for them, and making them slaves to time. But just at the right time, Jesus, the Timekeeper, rescues them and restores the broken clocks. Jesus is never late, and God is not slow in keeping his promises to us.

1 Master Clock Elastic Handle

- 1. Unpack the 32-inch, bronze wall clock
- **2.** Cut a 24" piece of the elastic cord.
- **3.** Tie one end of the elastic cord to the outer rim of the clock, to the left of the second digit of number 11, with a double knot.
- **4.** Tie the other end of the elastic cord to the outer rim of the clock, to the right of number 1, with a double knot.
- 5. Your clock is ready to hang out on the ladder!

PROPS_truction

2 Tempter's Magnetic Arrow

- **1.** Take the red arrow and clip the spinning portion with the suction cup together.
- **2.** Carefully, cut off the suction cup plastic.
- **3.** Super glue one of the magnets on top of the pre-existing suction cup plastic part of the arrow.
- **4.** If the ladder is not magnetic (metal), tape its complimentary magnet to the side of one of the legs.
- **5.** You should have a spinning arrow that can now stick to metal!



NOTE: Make sure the magnets are glued/taped with polar opposites facing each other.

3 Broken Clocks

- 1. For each 8-inch wall clock, grab a pair of shackles.
- 2. Cut 3 pieces of duct tape: one 8-inch long, and two 5-inch-long pieces.
- **3.** Place one end of the shackle right on top of the 8-inch wall clock and thread the 8-inch-long tape piece through the shackle. Tape vertically from the top of the clock frame to the back of the clock.
- **4.** Tape one of the 5-inch tape pieces horizontally along the top of the clock frame and on top of the vertical piece of tape.
- **5.** Tape the other 5-inch tape piece on the back of the clock, on top of the vertical piece of tape.
- **6.** The other end of the shackle should be loose, and your broken clock should look like a big, clunky and heavy version of the pocket watch.



PASTORING YOUR CAST

by Katie Luse

Below are a few practical tips on mentoring your cast.

Allow people time to get comfortable

I recommend placing a few scenes before you try to mine your cast emotionally and spiritually for connection with the story. A few hours of rehearsal will enable them to become comfortable with you, one another, and the stage or rehearsal space. After you make some technical progress, you can sit them down and begin asking questions about how they connect with the story.

? Set the vulnerability bar yourself

Transparency in groups generally comes through one courageous person who is willing to be vulnerable. After this vulnerability bar is set, it is much easier for the rest of the group to enter into trust with one another. I recommend that you, as the leader, consider being that person and share honestly with your group about your life, your story, and how it connects to the story you are telling in this piece.

? Find *Holy Spirit* moments

As you are teaching, you will find that there are certain moments in the piece that are primed for processing matters of the heart. This can include anything from a decision point on stage, to a response from Father God, a gesture of Jesus, a picture that sits with a weight of meaning, etc. When you recognize a moment of potential depth, stop the rehearsal. Ask people what they sense, feel, or see about this moment.

4 Ask questions

Questions will help draw out what is inside of your cast. Here are some helpful questions you can use in rehearsal and as homework for your cast between rehearsals. Make the questions specific to moments in the piece.

- 1. What is one moment in this piece that is personal to you?
- 2. What do you think is significant about this moment?
- 3. Is this moment real for you? Do you know it in experience?
- 4. What do you need to let go of?
- 5. What does this gesture mean to you?
- 6. How do you think Jesus feels in this moment?
- 7. What motivates people to run from God?
- 8. What motivates people to run toward God?

5 Prayer

Spend time praying together as a group.

NOTES ON CASTING

prayerfully

Prayerfully cast each role in this piece. People can be cast a role that God will use to challenge them and work in them during a season of their life.

A role can become personal in this ministry.

double cast

It can be helpful to double cast a role, especially that of the enemy. This will give a cast member the opportunity to play a redemptive role for certain performances rather than repeatedly playing a dark character.

INTERCESSORY PRAYER

Notes on the role of prayer in the Jesus Theatre Ministry

We believe that the effectiveness of Jesus Theatre is connected to the anointing of the Holy Spirit to draw people to Jesus. Prayer has a vital role in preparing the hearts of the cast, the audience, and the environment in which the ministry will take place. We recommend praying and worshiping together as a cast prior to each performance.

It is also important that the cast members maintain personal integrity before God and one another. An environment of open sharing regarding personal needs and spiritual growth will prove helpful in stewarding the cast to become noble vessels for God's use in this ministry.

Below are biblical prayers that can be used to strengthen the prayer culture of your group. These have proved fruitful when prayed in earnest by those who are hungry for God to move in a greater way. Consider choosing one or two to focus on as a cast, or write your own prayer that can be shared with your group.

The Holy Spirit loves to promote Jesus. He is excited about your heart for this ministry. He will back you up as long as you keep your focus on Him. One of the best ways to do this is to prioritize time for worship and prayer. Be assured that when this was written, you were also prayed for!

Enjoy the Presence of God as you share in this ministry. You can personally get filled up by taking time to experience God before, during, and after a Jesus Theatre performance. Remember, God cares for the laborers too. He is present for you.

Learn to love and make time for connecting with the Living God as you share His story! Make room for prayer in your Jesus Theatre Ministry. It will make a difference for you, your cast, and your audience.

Introduction

Who will introduce Jesus Theatre?

- 1 Preparing kids for what is coming allows them to have a full understanding and a more informed response afterwards.
- **2** Briefly introduce some of the props to look out for and a loose telling of the gospel message so they can look out for it as they watch.
- **3** Refer to *Overview of the Piece* as you consider how to present the introduction.
- **4** Remember to stay out of the way. Jesus Theatre portrays the message and the purpose is the response.

Transition/Altar Call

Who will lead the altar call? You may want to meet with them and provide Altar Call Training.

Assemble a Jesus Theatre prayer team on p. 64

Closing Celebration

Who will lead a celebration song to close? The program should finish with a positive and celebratory atmosphere so that children understand that these moments are a cause for celebration and joy.

Cabin Devotions

The evening after Jesus Theatre should focus on reflecting what they experienced during and after the presentation. You can find Cabin Devotions on p. 68. Here are some other reflection questions to foster open conversation and external processing:

- 1 Where did you see yourself in this piece?
- 2 Did you feel something? Talk about it. (Allow space for campers to share what they experienced. Support any questions with a spirit of encouragement, always guiding their minds back to the truth of Jesus' love and sacrifice for them.)
- **3** Do you want to pray about it?

/ Follow-Up

How will Jesus Theatre factor into the next gathering opportunity? A simple yet joyful reminder will encourage campers to reflect on their experience with fresh eyes after a good night's sleep (if it was the evening program), or after a full day of activity (if it was a morning program.)

ALTAR CALL TRAINING

Steps to an effective Altar Call after Jesus Theatre

1 Understanding the message and imagery of the piece

Imagery Recap:

Clockmaker: God, The Creator.

Master Clock: Perfect rhythm of God's creation, God's perfect plan. **Golden pocket watches:** Eternity and will of God set in our hearts.

The Tempter: The enemy, the thief of time.

Broken clocks: The illusion that the enemy gives us, humans, to take control of our own time.

Corrupted time.

The Timekeeper: Jesus, The Redeemer.

2 Translating that message into a personal invitation

3 Partnering with the Holy Spirit

Choosing the right person

Consider choosing someone for this role who is gifted in partnering with the Holy Spirit to communicate well and introduce people to Jesus. It also helps if this person is well acquainted with the Jesus Theatre piece and carries authority as a spiritual leader.

Giving the Altar Call

During the last scene of the piece, start praying for wisdom and insight on what God is doing during this presentation, and how to partner with Him. At the close of the piece, move to the microphone and begin the invitation.

Share that this moment is an invitation for people to give their lives to Jesus, just like the closing scene.

- Recap the story briefly using the imagery from the piece that the children have just seen. Link the story to a personal application for their lives explaining what the symbolism of the piece means.
- Invite those who want to receive Jesus as Lord of their life to stand up and come forward.

Prayer Time

Use your cast other spiritual leaders on camp as the prayer ministry team (See "Jesus Theater Prayer Team" below.)

Once the children have come forward and have settled in, begin a "repeat after me" salvation prayer with everyone who has responded to the altar call.

Salvation Prayer (example)

Dear Jesus, I believe that You are the Son of God. I believe that You died on the cross for my sins. I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I want You to be the leader of my life and my best friend. I invite You to come into my heart right now and become Lord of my life. Jesus, I choose to give my life to You today. Help me to always live my life for You. Amen.

- Invite the ministry team members to pray over the children near them.
 - Prayer Ministry team members should ask children if they can pray for them. Then, bless and agree with what God is doing in the children's lives for salvation, and offer to pray for them for the baptism of the Holy Spirit.
- Encourage everyone to return to their seats or linger in what God is doing. Dismiss the audience or hand the meeting over to a staff member who can direct them to their next activity.


Suggestions for Logistics

- Develop a Jesus Theatre Prayer Team equipped to pray for kids at the Altar as well as intercede during the piece.
- Assign four to six people to help direct traffic at the Altar ahead of time. They can send a few kids to each ministry team member.

Suggestions for Altar Call Process

Flowing with the Holy Spirit

- Learn to pause and wait during the invitation as you feel led. Holy Spirit is breath. You can learn to breathe with Him by allowing those in your care to enter into the divine moments that are presented.
- Feel free to extend multiple invitations if you feel that God is still working in the room among the audience.
- Don't try to do the Holy Spirit's job. Manipulation or control of any kind are not necessary and can be harmful.
- Keep the people in the room engaged by encouraging them to pray or be quiet to respect what God is doing.
- For the "repeat after me" prayer, tell the children you are going to lead them in a prayer to surrender their lives to Jesus. But that salvation is not in the words of the prayer, rather it's the position of their hearts before God.



Altar Call Activities

To create a more memorable moment of accepting the Lord as their savior, have a physical action or visual representation of this new commitment to the Lord. The activity can help camp staff identify kids from their groups to keep in prayer. This will vary from camp to camp, but here are some ideas for altar call activities:

COMMITMENT MURAL

Prepare a mural with foam board in a stationary location of your meeting space. Ask the children to write their names on a piece of paper or a small prop that resembles the theme. Then, ask the children to stick their names on the mural. Watch the mural grow as more commitments to Christ are made throughout the summer!

Be encouraged to celebrate with the youth!

PRAYER CIRCLES

Divide camp staff, Jesus Theatre Prayer Team, and/or Jesus Theatre Cast throughout the room during the altar call. Instruct children to join the group with the staff member closest to them, or by cabin for prayer with an adult leader. Let the Holy Spirit lead as you interact in prayer with the children.

IMMERSIVE THEATRE

As children enter the space, present an accessory that resembles the main prop of the Jesus Theatre production. Before the performance, instruct them to hold on to the prop as they watch the piece. During the invitation of the altar call, invite campers to give away or pin the accessory as a symbol of surrendering their lives to Jesus Christ. Relinquishing their accessory could also be a reminder of their commitment after Jesus Theatre.

"We're about to see a theatre production! But to become good audience members, we'll need to learn some proper theatre etiquette before the performance can begin. Here are some rules to follow and some things you should know.

- 1 No talking during the show. It will distract your neighbors and you might miss the best part.
- 2 Stay in your seats through the entire performance. If you need to use the restroom, let your counselor know before the show begins.
- 3 Listen and watch closely.
- You might see some friendly faces on the stage, but they are just actors playing a character. They are not really God or the enemy.
- You will hear many songs, and some you'll recognize! We know you love the tunes, but please don't clap when the songs begins to play, in between songs, or when a song concludes.
